Three, we're fans of the Evangelical Covenant denomination and feel that they will give us the freedoms and opportunities to work out our calling. Four, in addition to having family at GRX, we are very good friends with Victor, Christina & Justin—we lived together for a couple years—and we're excited about being in the same community together.

Some people have asked me where I envision leading GRX into the future. I certainly have my passions and convictions. But, honestly, my first impulse is to come with a listening posture. Without that, I don't think I can say with certainty what I could envision. But, if it helps at all, my overarching hope is that we can help make disciples that can follow Christ amid the particular challenges of our generation in the Bay Area. Inevitably, I think this will mean focusing on spiritual formation—both at the individual and community levels; re-envisioning the American Dream; doubling-down on community outreach, especially among the vulnerable and disenfranchised; and leadership development.
